#### The Talent Transformation project is comprised of three pillars:

#### **BUSINESS SERVICES:**

Develop and operate a network of Business-facing advanced & customized talent consulting, assessment and referral services to help business <u>attract</u>, <u>retain</u>, <u>upskill and reskill teams</u>.

#### **TALENT SERVICES**

Development and operation of **Talent-facing** network to support talent at all levels through the Michigan Works Agencies.

#### NETWORK DEVELOPMENT AND ALIGNMENT

**Creating alignment** with key talent stakeholders





The program aims to retain executive-level talent within the ecosystem by embedding them with early-stage mobility companies to help achieve specific milestones.



DRC through Detroit Drives Degrees will strengthen the talent pipeline. Detroit Drives Degrees seeks to increase the proportion of individuals with college degrees and high-skill credentials in the region.



DFC is a THINK and DO tank with a focus on Equity for Detroit residents. They will concentrate on worker experience, convening tables, equity measurements.





Global Detroit has metrics associated with the higher ed students and immigrant inclusion. They work with the Immigrant student population to retain that talent pool in Michigan through internship programs with Michigan Businesses.



Upwardly Global has metrics associated with the Immigrant refugee population and transitioning that population into the workforce.



Michigan Founders Fund works with high-growth entrepreneurs committed to fellowship, culture, and funding solutions that uplift communities across the state and has metrics associated with tech student internships.

#### **GEM: HISTORICALLY EXCLUDED COMMUNITIES**

GEM's HEC definition is inclusive and broad, but distinct to address issues specifically to each sector. The GEM's DEI advisory workgroup will evolve the definition in consultation with the GEM corecipients, as needed.
